- Underinsured original survey is from University of Colorado
 - o Over 3000 surveys have been collected
 - o The manuscript is currently under review at the Journal of Pediatrics
 - o Abstract was accepted to the 2011 PBRN meeting

Social Capital Study-

- o Bill, Jack, and Adrienne are working on the cross sectional paper
- o Diabetes data collection is finished
 - 300 surveys collected thus far
 - Diabetes abstract was presented at the 2011 PAS meeting.

- o Key informant interviews are complete.
- o All focus groups are finished
- The best practices guide has been drafted and will eventually be put online

- Colleen and Caroline developed a survey to determine what parents know about their child's use of social media, parental attitudes and beliefs toward social media and its effect on the family, and to compare parent perceptions of their adolescent's social media use with actual use.
- o Goal is the begin data collection by Fall 2011
