1. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Three new student research assistants (Ashley Carroll, Adrija Chaterjee and Elani Sanders) were hired and trained. They join Stephanie Cooper (employee research assistant) in conducting the partnership surveys in the community and sub-specialty clinics, as well as assisting in a number of other projects.
- Currently have three fourth year and one third year medical students assisting with SOAR-Net research efforts; two of the fourth year students are doing so to fulfill requirements of a research elective
- Partnership proposal was funded through Dayton Children's Hospital Foundation
- PRIME Net Center, based at Wayne State University, has received renewal funding for Year 2
- SOAR-Net will offer to up-date and manage PRIME-NET's web site

3. COMMUNITY COORDINATOR REPORT

- Continue to work on parent blog to guide research ideas for SOAR-Net

4. PROJECTS REPORT

- SOAR-Net is interested in participating in a community outreach project sponsored by PRIME-Net
- PRINS final report was reviewed. Absent from the report was the number of different clinicians that participated. The number is 31 from the fifteen practices
- Health literacy. Currently on-hold until a new follow-up strategy is developed
- Over 120 partnership surveys have been completed
- Dr. Khamis is working on three year (2009-2011) underinsurance data
- Miryoung is recruiting overweight children into a study that includes an MRI of their abdomen and a blood draw. She will distribute flyers to interested practices.

5. NEW BUSINESS

- The University of New Mexico has translated the obesity survey into Spanish and have expressed interest in working with Miryoung.
